Zoom: First Time User's Guide

CHOOSE**MATHS** Mentoring uses a program called Zoom to run the fortnightly 'live' mentoring sessions. Zoom is a useful resource with video, audio, messaging, screen sharing, annotating and whiteboard capacities. Each mentoring circle will be allocated a Zoom 'meeting room' where you will be able to talk with the others in your circle.

This document will take you through how to use Zoom and introduce you to the features you need to take part in CHOOSE**MATHS** Mentoring.

GETTING STARTED

- ☞ At the time of your mentoring session, click on the Zoom meeting room link.
- ☞ You will be directed to the Zoom meeting launch page. **Click on download & run Zoom.**
- ☞ If you prefer not to download the Zoom app onto your computer, or are having issues running Zoom, you can also join the meeting directly from your browser by clicking on **Join from your browser.**


👉 If you join from your browser, you will be asked to enter a name. **Use only your first name.**




Input your name to join the conference

👉 If you have downloaded Zoom, next time you need to log on for a mentoring session, you can join from the Zoom app on your computer.




👉 Type in the 9-digit meeting ID number at the end of the Zoom meeting room url link. For example, if your meeting room link is <https://unimelb.zoom.us/j/123456789>, then your 9 digit meeting ID is 123-456-789



BASIC FEATURES


☞ Once you have joined the Zoom room, you can mute your microphone, turn your video on or off, enter full screen mode and leave the meeting at any time.



SCREEN SHARING

☞ As a mentor, you may want to share your screen with the others in your group to show them presentation slides, features of a website or a project you've been working on. By accessing screen sharing, you can select which window on your computer you'd like to share.

☞ Click on the green **Share Screen** button on the bottom tab of the Zoom screen. You can choose to share an open document, a website or the whiteboard feature.



☞ Ensure that you are only sharing appropriate content and be wary of pop-ups and ads on websites like YouTube.

WHITEBOARD FEATURE (in screen sharing)


☞ The whiteboard allows for free-style drawing, typing, sketching and shape drawing by all participants.

ANNOTATING

☞ It is also possible to annotate in screen-sharing. This is useful if you would like to emphasise a point or draw everyone's attention to something particular on the screen.

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
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MONITORING PARTICIPANTS




A participant can raise their hand, say yes or no, and give other feedback.

☞ By clicking the **Participants** button at the bottom of your screen (or at the top if you are screen sharing), you can see who is in the session, whether they are muted, and whether they are giving you feedback.

You can use these features to interact with your mentees during the session, asking questions or finding out when they would like to speak.

TEXT CHAT

👉 You may want to talk to the others in your mentoring circle via the chat feature. This can be a good way to get responses to questions from everybody at the same time to avoid people talking over one another. Click on **Chat** and a panel will open on the right hand side. Type messages in here that you would like everyone to see.

Type messages to everyone here

By default Zoom will allow its members to chat with everyone, but if you would like to restrict this feature, you can click the 'More' button to allow attendees to chat with the host only.

A FINAL NOTE

CHOOSEMATHS mentoring circles are places of respect. Please be mindful of child protection and web safety rules when screen sharing on Zoom and make sure that anything you say and share is appropriate and safe.
