IMPORTANT: Have your students inserted a Creative Commons Licence?

Before uploading each video to YouTube, the appropriate Creative Commons Licence image must be included in the video. This is in order to protect your students' rights as creators of the video.

Your students need to go to the creative commons licence website (below) and use the licence features to choose the kind of licence they would like: <https://creativecommons.org/choose/>

Once they have decided upon the type of licence they would like to use, they must get a copy of the cc video bumper (https://wiki.creativecommons.org/wiki/CC_video_bumpers) and the image must be placed somewhere in the video, usually at the beginning or the end. If it helps, look at last year's videos to see how they were placed.

The most commonly used video licence is the one shown below. This means that people cannot adapt your students' work or use it for commercial purposes without permission. If this is the one your students want, you can simply copy it from here to be added to their videos.
